Proceedings of the Seminar

on

Library and Knowledge System : Today and Tomorrow

The “National Level Seminar on Library and Knowledge System: Today and Tomorrow” was held on 10th & 11th of March 2023. The seminar was sponsored by Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation and organized by Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College. The seminar venue was Sri Ma Sarada Devi Hall, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (RKMVCC), Rahara, Kolkata- 700118. The Seminar Convenor was Dr. Rabi Kumar Dey, Librarian, RKMVCC and the Joint Convenor was Dr. Sudipta Biswas, Librarian, RKMVCC. Patron for the seminar was Swami Kamalasthananda, Principal, RKMVCC and Swami Vedanuragananda, Controller of Examination; RKMVCC was the Advisor for the national level seminar.

There are 131 registered participants through Google forms. The link for the seminar registration was <https://forms.gle/X3zf7qoJFxaTU4a17>. Most of the participants were librarians and students. There is no registration fee for the participants. There are total six guest lecturers from several renowned institutes of our country. Namely Dr. Narayan Ch. Ghosh, Librarian, IIM Calcutta, Dr. Sibsankar Jana, Associate Professor, University of Kalyani, Dr. Bulu Maharana, Professor, Sambalpur University, Mr. Arup Roy Choudhury, Former Deputy Librarian and Library in-charge ISI Kolkata, Dr. Udayan Bhattacharya, Professor, Jadavpur University and Dr. R.K. Mahapatra, Professor, Tripura University. There are fourteen abstract presentations on various themes of the seminar. Sub themes of the seminar were; Emerging Technologies in Library, Intellectual Property Rights, Academic Integrity and Plagiarism, Learning Resources and Its Management, and Library Analytic.

The seminar was started at 09:30 am on 10/03/2023 with spot registration and attendance. The Inaugural Speech was started at 10:30am. Inaugural Speech was delivered by, Swami Kamalasthananda, the principle of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College. He had discussed on various e-



resources types and characteristics of e-resources, how it works with it. He has shown various links of e-resources belongs to the branches of anthropology, geography, history, political science, public administration, psychology, education, population studies, women studies, etc. He had also discussed about primary information sources for example; patent, research papers, etc. He also mentioned about knowledge discovery projects, various abstracting and indexing databases, science citation indexing databases, different library catalogue (mainly online library catalogue), online book sealing sites, online dictionary, encyclopaedia, acronyms and abbreviation sites, subject heading sites, handbooks and manuals, maps and GIS based sites, etc. Swamiji also put some lights on few very critical issues like; online resources in teaching and research, IPR issue, storage issue stability issue, selection and acquisition issue, etc. Principle Maharaj showed the growth of technology from 1890s to 2023, he had showed how online and correspondence courses develop and changed in this time period. He had discussed about the growth of online courses and role of India's contribution in it, for example; Shyam, EPG-pathshala, etc.

The first technical session started at 11:00 am after a short tea break. First speaker for the session was Dr Narayan Chandra Ghosh, librarian IIM Calcutta, histitle for the talk was "Academic Integrity and Plagiarism". He discussed on academic ethics and integrity. He pointed out different communication and publication channels. Discussed on journal publishing history how commercial houses entered in channel publishing scholarly communication. He discussed on Article Processing Charge (APC) and how publishers are making revenue from this. He discussed different approaches of Open Access like; Green Open Access, Gold Open Access, etc. He also mentioned about Predatory Journals and Academic Integrity and discussed about different ways to identify predatory journals. Dr. Ghosh also discussed difference between referencing and bibliography and various UGC regulation regarding publication and plagiarism, different law related to plagiarism in India.

The second lecturer of the first technical session was Dr. Shiv Shankar Jana, Associate Professor, department of library and information science University of Kalyani. His topic of discussion was "Literature review and Referencing". He had showed 7th steps in details for doing literature review. He discussed



different publication discovery tools, bibliography coupling and citation indexes. Dr. Jana discussed insightful publication discovery tools in detail and he also showed how it helps in academic research. He discussed different citation styles and discussed different citation tools.

After lunch the second technical session for the first day was started at 02:30 pm. In this session one guest lecturer and seven abstract presentations was delivered. Dr. Bulu Maharana, Professor, Sambalpur University, had spoken on Open Assess (OA) and Scholarly Communication. He discussed the present issues and future prospects of open access and scholarly communication. He had introduced the philosophy of Open Access, discussed benefits of open access, different types of OA and impact of OA movement. He discussed how information overload is affecting modern society. Dr. Maharana demonstrate three pillarof OA, OA Publishing, OA Support and OA Archiving.

The abstract presentation session was Chaired by Dr. Shiv Shankar Jana, Associate Professor, department of library and information science University of Kalyani. The list of Presenter and the title of the abstract is given bellow;

The first day of the seminar was ended with a tea and snacks after these presentations.

The second day of the seminar started at 10:30 am, 11/03/2023 with welcome tea. First lecturer of the first technical session was Mr. Arup Roy Choudhury. Former Deputy Librarian and Library-in-charge, ISI, Calcutta delivered his talk



on ChatGPT as an e-resource. He discussed meaning of open AI, what is ChatGPT, availability and future improvements. He discussed in detail various key concepts of ChatGPT, how ChatGPT works, difference between Google and ChatGPT, Application of ChatGPT in Libraries. He also discussed ISF-Natural language search, ISF-Multilingual support, Virtual assistants, and technical issues in Research Assistance. He showed that translation service of ChatGPT is very poor especially in case of Bengali language. He also discussed content creation, Metadata Generation and Pitfalls of ChatGPT.

The second speaker of first technical session was Dr. Udayan Bhattacharya, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Jadavpur University delivered his speech on Fake News. He described the term 'post truth' and 'post truth era'. He discussed various types of misinformation and disinformation, what is Fake News, how is Fake News generated, Fake news creators, effect of fake news and how to stop fake news. He also discussed difference between fake news and wrong information. He talked about media literacy and role of librarian.

The second technical session of the second day was contended with one guest lecturer and seven abstract presentations. The guest lecturer was Dr. Rabindra Kumar Mahapatra, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Tripura University delivered his talk on Library Profession in Knowledge society: today and tomorrow. He defined Library and Information Science as a profession, librarianship : the recent past, dull image, poor image of profession, low expectation, Invisibility , quality of services etc. He discussed transformation of information, Five laws of Library Science and its transition point. He clearly described the 9Cs of Library Profession in Knowledge Society, Harmonization of LIS education, IFLA Trends Report 2013 & 2021, Challenges of Library Profession.

The abstract presentation session was chaired by Dr. Rabindra Kumar Mahapatra, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Tripura University. The list of Presenter and the title of the abstract is given bellow;

The seminar attracted a significant number of faculties working in colleges, universities and research institutes. The members of the teaching community got an exposure to some of the frontier areas of research carried out nowadays with an enhanced emphasis on various field of 'Library and Knowledge System : Today and Tomorrow'. They used the seminar as a platform to discuss several pertinent issues such as exposing the college-level students to the prospects of the Library and Knowledge System. The direct interactions between the academician and research scientists paved the way for improved collaboration between colleges and research institutes, and motivated some younger faculties to undertake research projects even with limited infrastructural facilities available in most of the undergraduate colleges.



Students from different undergraduate and post graduate colleges attended the seminar in large number. Seldom they get an opportunity to listen from such learned speakers, and they thoroughly enjoyed the 2-days' proceedings. On the one hand the students got an exposure to different interdisciplinary research work being carried out worldwide and realized the gradually vanishing "barriers" that exist in traditional and on the other hand they could directly interact with the speakers. All the speakers encouraged the students to actively participate in the discussion which was arranged after each lectures. The direct interaction cleared their doubts and motivated many young participants to engage in research work. Research scholars also actively interacted with the invited guests comprising of members from academia and research institutes. Some of them were greatly benefited from the suggestions from the learned participants.

The college had the honour to host such distinguished members of intellectual community. The seminar was well organized and earned praises from the participants. The infrastructural and organizational capability of the college to host such event was put to test, and the successful hosting of the event has made the college confident to hold any seminar / workshop event of a larger scale in future. The event was locally publicized and the citizens of the neighborhood of the college felt proud that such an event is being organized by the college.
