

**Brief Report of National Seminar**  
**On**  
**Digital Technologies in Libraries for Next Generation**

The National Seminar on “**Digital Technologies in Libraries for Next Generation**” sponsored by Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation, Ministry of Culture, Government of India under Aazadi Ka Amrit Mahotsv held on July 22-23, 2022 was inaugurated by Prof. C.R. Suthar, Dean, University College of Social Science and Humanities, Mohanlal Sukhadia University, Udaipur. In his address speech Prof. C.R. Suthar highlighted the significant role of Digital Technologies, Libraries and Information Centres. Prof. Pradeep Trikha, Associate, Dean, suggested participants to widen their research and educational activities by focusing and utilizing the available emerging technologies and various on-line tools for quality academic development. Prof Arti Prasad, Professor In-charge Central Library, MLSU, Prof. S.K. Kataria, Chairman, Faculty of Social Sciences and Prof. Jagtar Singh, were also addressed the gathering.

The seminar comprised various technical sessions. Each session dealt with invited lecture also. The lectures were delivered on following topics:

The participants were acquired with the fact that the last decade has witnessed a remarkable hike in the number and complexity of emerging technologies, e-resources in library and a shift from print to digital materials as well. And because of the proliferation of digital emerging technological tools, electronic

resources and user preferences for the electronic format, these are becoming essential mainstays of any library. Looking to New Education Policy, Libraries and Information centres are moving, focusing and revamping their services for digital society. Digital and Electronic resources such as journals, books, indexes, abstracts, encyclopedias, reference books, aggregator databases, and full-text or partially full-text databases are changeable and so the strategies to manage them effectively were also discussed. The seminar was intended to unearth the search and discovery of e-resources, digital technologies; it imparted experience of exploring issues, challenges, outcomes of Digital Technologies in future.

### **Findings/Recommendations:**

Following are the suggestions that were observed/raised by the participants:

1. The participants accentuated for more sessions on emerging technologies and NEP.

2. It has been observed during interactions with the participants there is lack of awareness about the NEP, research ethics and E-Learning tools as well. Therefore it is strongly recommended that the department conducts such programmes frequently for fulfilling the information needs of the scholars and facilitating research.
3. All the participants have demanded to organize a training program on E-Content, MOOCs, SPSS and e-resources in future.
4. A training programme on how to modernized libraries and boost searching skills has been strongly demanded by the participants. Therefore, a user-orientation programme is recommended for the same.
