PREAMBLE:

The digital transformations are more visible in Indian Economy, society, science and education, culture and politics, and our social, private and business lives are all undergoing a digital transformation especially during last two decades using emerging and innovative ICT, social and mobile technologies. During a short period of time, we have moved from *experimentation* to *implementation*. On the other hand, Transformation of Cities to smart cities mans Transformation is possible by harmonic integration of infrastructure, citizen, and administration. The concept of smart city in Indi is a framework for implementing the vision of advanced and modern urbanization. This vision envisages the achievement of three goals:

- ▶ social equitability,
- ▶ economic viability, and
- ▶ Environmental sustainability.

The digital transformations having the impact on the smart library work through the change of information products and services and the creation and management of **digital and online resources**. The smart libraries need to focus on user or customer centric services and infrastructure facilities. The mind set of LIS professionals need to re-focus for achieving successful digital transformation of libraries. With this background the organizing committee aptly chosen International Conference on the theme i.e., "**Digital Transformation: Moving towards Developing Smart Libraries**". Out of **84** papers **11** papers are written by individual authors, **35** are contributed by **two** authors and **31** are by **three** authors and only **7** articles are by more than **three** authors. This shows the extent of Co-authorship and Collaboration in LIS research activities in the country as well as abroad.

DAY ONE: Friday, 22nd April, 2022:

INAUGURAL CEREMONY:

The grand opening ceremony was marked by the presence of a large strength of LIS fraternity with the rich legacy associated with the Department Studies and Research in Library and Information Science, Tumkur University and the brand of LPA made an auspicious opening for the i-Koal-2022 Conference on "**Digital Transformation: Moving towards Developing Smart Libraries**" opened at prestigious venue i.e., Sir M. Visvesvaraya Auditorium, Tumkur University, Tumakuru. Marked by the presence of a large number of delegates from across the India and abroad, in total the conference received an overwhelming response. The inaugural ceremony of the conference began with an invocation rendered by **Mrs.**

The emergence of knowledge witnessed the sea change due to technological transmission from palm leaf to palm top. Especially the digital transmission posed lots of challenges as well great opportunities for LIS professionals to showcase all the information products and services to satisfy tech savvy generation by creating smart libraries. Presidential Address

Prof. Keshava, the honorable Acting Vice-Chancellor of Tumkur University, Tumakuru in his presidential remarks appreciated and congratulated the activities and professional commitments of LPA and its dedicated team members. Prof. Keshava advised to LIS fraternity that, the professionals need to be innovate, capacity building in adopting suitable ICT enabled technologies in the age of digital transmission. The digital and online resources are coming in an environmental ecosystem. He was dissatisfied with special reference to web accessibility guidelines are not properly understood and not implemented by many libraries to remove the information access barriers especially for the Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). Prof. Keshava concluded his presidential address by saying "the talk is not enough but act upon is the agenda of the conference."

Dr. Anand Jha, Treasurer, LPA, New Delhi proposed the vote of thanks. **Dr. Rupesh Kumar**, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Library and Information, Tumkur University, Tumakuru was the master of the ceremony.

Technical Sessions:

The first technical session of the International Conference was Chaired by **Prof. Mallinath Kumbar**, Dept. of Library and Information Science, University of Mysore, Mysuru and Co-Chair by **Ms. Vandana Chandere**, Library in-charge, NIV, Pune. **Dr. Mohan T A**, Chief Librarian, Siddaganga Institute of Technology, Tumakuru was the Rapporteur.

Prof. Jean-Charles, Lamirel from University of Strasbourg - **France**, University of Dalian - China LORIA - France delivered the scholarly and intellectual keynote address on the theme "**Central Role of Artificial Intelligence in New Generation of Libraries**". Based on his professional research experience the AI and Machine Learning has strategic role to play in information management and diffusion. AI process will help text mining as well indexing of more relevant and appropriate information and data from the document. The AI automatically extracts the data and gives summary of the document. Finally Prof. Charles highlighted some of the problems associated while using of AI and ML for information identification, search and retrieval but also gave solutions how to overcome them.

Only one out of seven papers was presented in the first technical session by the respective authors. The paper mainly focused on marketing of library products and services as a case study of college library.

Technical Session Two:

The second technical session was commenced after the Lunch Break Chaired by Dr. Shishir Mandalia, University Librarian SPU, Anand, Gujarat and the Co-chair was Prof. M Doraswamy Dravidian University, Kuppam. Ms. Gunjan Jain, ILI, New Delhi was the Rapporteur.

Before the contributors paper presentation, the information and knowledge based product Presentation was made by Rapid Radio Solutions, Ahmedabad on effective use of RFID technology in libraries.

In this session out of **11** papers scheduled **6** papers were presented. The presented papers are mainly focusing on use of Open access and Open Education Resources, impact of ICT on libraries, need for digital literacy skills, information searching skills, digital library initiatives and the importance of MOOCs.

Technical Session Three:

The third session was stated after the tea break. The Chairman of this session was **Prof. Krishnamurthy C**, Professor, Dept. of Library and

Information Science, Karnatak University, Dharwad and Dr. Sathish Kumar, Technical Office, DRDO, Co-chair and Ms. Mamta Amarpuri Librarian, Darshan Academy, Delhi was Rapportuer. Out of the 11 papers listed for the session **8** were presented by the authors.

The subjects discussed on the themes are Smart libraries, Use of ICT tools, usage of digital repository, Innovative practices in libraries, Metadata for Geographical Indicators, Scientometric study.

After presentation of all the papers, the floor was open of discussion. Delegates raised few questions as well as seek the clarifications and the presenters of the papers answered the queries.

DAY TWO: SATURDAY, 23rd April, 2022

Technical Session Four:

The technical sessions were commenced on the Second day of the conference. Session-wise detailed Report is presented here.

Fourth technical session was started on the second day of the International conference. This session was chaired by Lalita Dheer, Librarian, PGIMER, Chandigarh and Co-chair, Dr. Sathish Kumar H T, Technical Officer, DRDO, Gwalior and Mr. H P Pandey, Librarian, LHMC, New Delhi was the Rapporteur.

In this session out of 10 papers, **six** papers were presented by the respective authors. The papers mainly constituted on Artificial intelligence, Virtual reality, open access resources, User studies, Knowledge Management, Emerging trends and technologies, Library services through phonic applications, Prevention of Plagiarism.

After presentation of all the papers, the floor was open of discussion. Delegates raised few questions as well as seek the clarifications and the presenters of the papers answered the queries.

The fifth technical session was Chaired by Dr. M. Vijayakumar, University Librarian, Pondicherry University, Puducherry and Co-Chair Dr. D D Lal, Head, Library, NBRC, Gurugam and Dr. Seema B. Gokhle, Librarian, BACL, Mumbai was the Rapporteur for the session. In this session 11 papers were listed out of which 8 papers are presented by the learned authors. The papers were mainly concentrated on Plagiarism software, IPR and Copyright literacy, Altmetric analysis, ISB, Publishing Ethics, Block chain technology, use of e-resources.

the interaction was very lively and the questions were aptly answered by the authors.

The paper on "Mobile alerting services" invited many appreciations and it received a very good response from the audience.

The technical session six was Chaired by Dr. Atul Bhatt, Associate Professor, Gujarat University, Ahmedabad and Dr. Nagappa Bakkannanavar, Head, IRC, Tata Consultancy Services, Bengaluru and Dr. Shantashree Sengupta, Librarian, MCASC, Pune served as a Rapporteur

In this session there were 10 papers out of which 7 papers were presented. The papers mainly were on Tourism information services, ISB, Metric analysis, ICT infrastructure, Best Practices in libraries, Web impact factor analysis, Evaluation of Institutional Repositories, Library associations and networks, Print media since pre-independence.

The delegates interacted with the authors and put some interesting questions and sought some clarifications of the mode of the case studies.

The concluding session i.e., seventh session of the conference was on Social Networking and Web 2.0 technologies. Dr. Vinitha K., Librarian, St. Mary's College (Autonomous) Thoothukudi and Mr Kuldeep Chand, Deputy Librarian, Raj. University, Bikaner Chair and Co-Chaired the session and Ms. Ekta Jain, NIV, ICMR, Pune acted as Rapportuer.

In this session 18 papers were listed of which 3 papers were presented. The authors made presentations on Transformation in services, collections, space and operational activities in libraries, New Bibliometric Indicators, Scientometric and Bibliometrics studies, Institutional Repositories in Karnataka, Indian open access repositories, Rural public libraries in Karnataka, Swayam courses, Preservation and conservations of manuscripts, Open books exam, Use of e-resources by paddy farmers, LIS open access journals, Promoting agricultural information to farmers.
